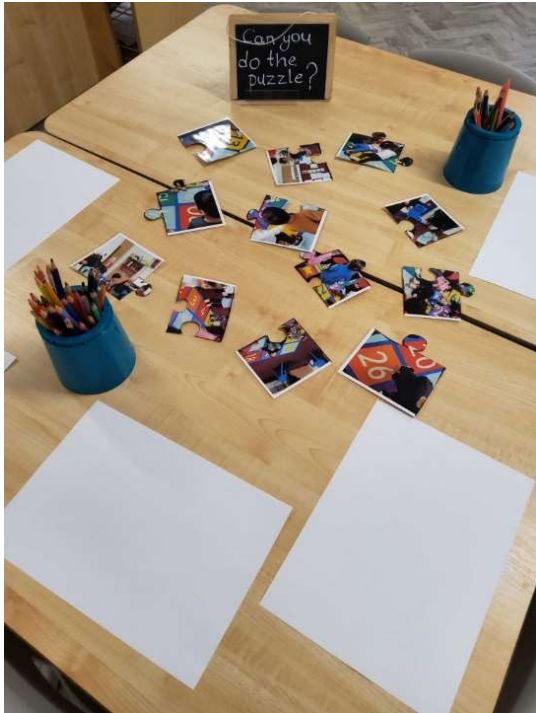




News Story – International Puzzle Day
