News Story – World Rose Day

Babies

Today is World Rose Day, the babies have been playing and exploring the texture of roses. We added rose petals to the water on our tuff trays for them to explore.

Children used tweezers to pick up rose petals they had added to the glittered water. We mixed different scents such as lemon, mint, and vanilla for the children to explore.





We have set up a perfume tuff tray where the children explored and created their own scent. We also added rose water to our water tray encouraging children to explore their senses.

We have also set up a sensory

tray where we have put roses and coloured scarfs down, we have also added different colour pasta and magnifying glasses to encourage the older babies to explore different textures and colours.







Toddlers

Today the toddlers are learning about Rose Day at Nursery. We set up exciting activities for children to take part in. We have pink rose petals in the water with pink colour for children to scoop the roses out using the continuous water provision resources.

We also had a messy rose and leaf printing activity on the tuff tray for children to print. Children enjoyed exploring different colours and printing the beautiful roses.









On the mathematical table we set up a tuff tray for children to count and match the petals and leaves to the correct number. This encouraged children to enhance their fine motor skills, counting and turn taking. We also had colouring pictures on the mark making table for children to colour.







Pre-School





Today we had set out a range of different activities for the children based on Rose Day.

On our main activity table, we had set up a rose printing activity where children dipped fresh red roses into red paint and stamped onto cards.

In our water tray we put Rose petals, leaves and bubbles for children to find the petals in the bubbles.





In our messy play area, we had playdough set out with rose petals for children to make their own cupcakes. Children thoroughly enjoyed all the different activities.
