Babies

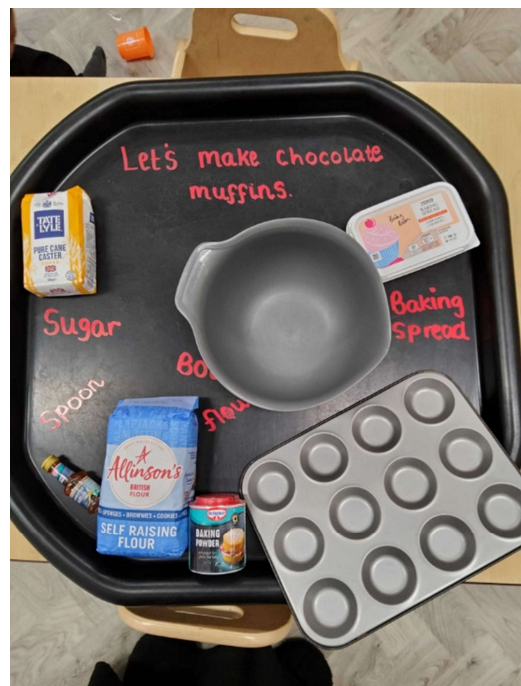

We also made a point to introduce new vocabulary related to baking, such as "mix" and "pour," to expand the children's language and understanding of the process.

The baking activity provided an excellent opportunity for the children to practise turn taking and sharing. They thoroughly enjoyed passing the spoon and taking turns mixing the muffin mixture demonstrating good teamwork.

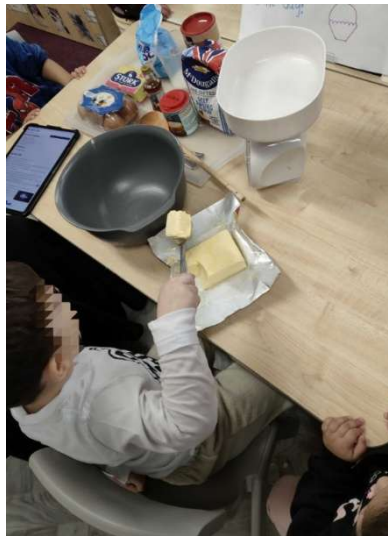




Toddlers

Today, the children took part in celebrating 'World Chocolate Day.' To mark the occasion, the toddlers engaged in an exciting baking activity, choosing to make delicious chocolate cupcakes.

Before beginning the baking process, we discussed the various ingredients required for making chocolate cupcakes. Children were encouraged to observe and describe the texture and scent of each ingredient. They explored the different textures by touching the flour, baking soda, and eggs.



Toddlers thoroughly enjoyed participating in each step. They took turns pouring the ingredients, cracking the eggs, and mixing everything together. During the egg cracking activity, we described the appearance of the eggs both outside the shell and inside. This hands-on experience allowed children to engage their senses and develop a deeper understanding of the ingredients.

Once the mixture was ready, the children carefully poured it into cupcake cases. The filled cases were then sent to the kitchen to bake. We talked together about how the cupcakes would change in appearance after baking, noting the differences between the raw mixture and the cooked cupcakes.



Overall, the children enjoyed the baking activity. It provided a wonderful opportunity to celebrate 'World Chocolate Day' while learning about baking and exploring different textures and scents.
