Indoor Learning

Indoors, the math's area featured a fun and interactive matching game where the children paired numbered flowers with the correct empty plant pots, helping to strengthen their early number recognition skills. At the messy table, the children used playdough to create their own flowers, expressing their creativity while developing fine motor skills. They also watched a short, informative video about planting, which helped deepen their understanding of how seeds grow and what plants need to thrive.



During story time, we focused on *Jack and the Beanstalk*. The children were fascinated by the idea of magic beans and enjoyed discussing how they grow, sparking curiosity and imaginative thinking.
